In the 2022-2023 operating year, Community Futures Pan West Network hosted the Virtual Showcase Rural Opportunities Fund. This showcased 36 Community Futures innovative projects from across the west. Building upon the success of the Rural Opportunity Fund (ROF), PrairiesCan partnered with us to develop ROF 2.0. This project was recently approved in the amount of \$3.85 million for three years, ending on March 31, 2026.

PrairiesCan also funded the "Building Capacity and Responding to Growing Regional Business Demands" project, allowing Community Futures offices across the Prairies access to invaluable resources in helping them fully utilize their capacity within their office and local community. The project was administered by the Community Futures Pan West Network with great success!



The CFLI Board Development Program reached a remarkable milestone by delivering an unprecedented 86 Board Development sessions in the 2022-2023 operating year. We are continuously moving forward with our Visioning Towards the Future 2030 initiative by completing several strategies that align with Vision 2030. Plus, we are pleased to be hosting the Community Futures Pan West Conference in February 2024. Join us in shaping the future of our communities.




Virtual Showcase ROF Event

36 approved projects showcased.

On May 17 - 20, 2022, Community Futures Pan West Network (CFPWN) hosted the ROF Virtual Showcase event. This event highlighted the 36 projects approved through the ROF program.

Projects covered tourism, succession planning, business start-up programs, e-commerce, immigration pilots, as well as training, coaching, and pivoting business. Community Futures Pan West Network also dedicated an area on their website to the ROF legacy. Community Futures members can find the 36 projects, the amount they were approved for, project descriptions, showcase videos, and additional supporting documents in this area. Funding for Prairies Community Futures Organizations

Building Capacity and Responding to Growing Regional Business Demands.

At the beginning of February 2023, Community Futures Pan West Network board (CFPWN) announced the administration of a one-time injection of project funding up to \$50,000.00. Funded by Prairies Economic Development Canada, this project focused on "Building Capacity and Responding to Growing Regional Business Demands".

The project based funding enabled Community Futures organizations access to resources needed to successfully build capacity within their organizations and communities. Funding was allocated to an array of projects from updating office procedures, equipping staff and volunteers with valuable training to revamping work-spaces, and more. The funding has enhanced efficiency and has provided an improved environment for both the Community Futures organizations and the communities they serve.

Prairies Rural Opportunities Fund (ROF) 2.0

Community Futures Pan West Network announced the approval of Prairies Rural Opportunities Fund 2.0 in the amount of \$3.85 million.

The goal of the Prairies Rural Opportunities Fund (ROF 2.0) is to support Prairies Economic Development Canada's (PrairiesCan) Community Futures organizations to:

- Assist with the development of innovative business strategies
- Build business and community capacity through partnerships
- Devise solutions to assist rural communities face the challenges posed by an aging population and the closure of major local employers
- Promote and assist with the development and adoption of advanced technologies
- Offer specialized training that will enable businesses to reach their goals, and
- Facilitate the transition of rural small businesses
- Community based projects.

Funded initiatives are expected to promote, support and/or facilitate sector development and the building of greater capacity in rural communities and small businesses, including startups, existing businesses, young entrepreneurs, women entrepreneurs, Indigenous entrepreneurs, new Canadians, and co-operatives. It is also anticipated that ROF 2.0 funded initiatives will help generate new business opportunities, and include the engagement of other community partners.

Community Futures Pan West Network hosted two informational webinars on February 27th to provide an overview of the program and answer any questions Prairies Community Futures organizations had.

The application process for the Rural Opportunities Fund 2.0 is officially open, with the first ROF 2.0 Adjudication Committee meeting scheduled for May 5, 2023.



Visioning Towards the Future: Towards 2030

The Community Futures Pan West Network would like to acknowledge and thank the 2022-2023 Visioning Towards the Future: 2030 committees. Their passion and commitment were integral in allowing us to support the scope of the Visioning Towards the Future.

During October of 2022, Community Futures Pan West Network established three Vision 2030 committees:

- Staff Curriculum Committee
- Staff Committee
- Loans Committee.

The committees are comprised of one representative from each western province. The committees were tasked with roles and responsibilities that supported the five strategies aligned to Vision 2030.

The members of the Vision 2030 committees played a key role in accomplishing the following tasks:

Staff Curriculum Committee:

Completed the Orientation Kit for New Managers

Staff Committee:

Provided input with the creation of the best practices, local projects, and event website pages.

Loans Committee:

- Discussed and reviewed modern client offerings ie. Online RRRF portal.
- Assessed the value of creating a two-tier loan assessment based on score cards to speed up approval time.
- The loan committee was instrumental in gathering a risk assessment template a loan summary report template which has been uploaded on the Community Futures Pan West Network website.

A part of the strategies aligned to Vision 2030 was to continue the discussion and engagement with PrairiesCan towards funding for the Rural Opportunities Fund 2.0. We have successfully secured funding of 3.85 million starting April 1, 2023 for 3 years.

Additionally, the Community Futures Pan West Network board has approved hosting a CF Pan West Network conference in Kelowna, British Columbia. Conference dates are February 25 - 27, 2024. We hope to see you there!

ApplyNow Application Portal Demonstration Webinar

CFLI Board Development Program 2-For-1 Promotion


Community Futures Pan West Network offered a Board Development two-for-one module promotion for Community Futures offices across western Canada. The promotion was a success. It sold out within one week.

Module 15: Volunteer Attraction, Retention, and Succession

We are excited to announce Module 15: Volunteer Attraction, Retention, and Succession has been added to the video vignette online board development library.

These training vignettes are not meant to replace the full three-hour board development training modules, but rather provide a brief overview of content that is covered in the more comprehensive program.

Each module contains a three to five-minute training video and corresponding downloadable exercises. The videos are intended to be played at board meetings, with board members working through the exercise after watching the video. This allows board members to sample this CFLI course content, helping them determine the areas where they would like to receive the more comprehensive three-hour training associated with each module.

Module 10: Advances in the Social Economy

Module 10 has been revised and is now available for FREE to Community Futures offices who are encouraged to download and use as a facilitation tool with Community Futures boards and/or communities.
